# Legacy Giving Supports Future Emerging

The Peaks Island Fund is in its 11th year of bringing together people who share one powerful thread: the love of Peaks Island. This is also the year that the Peaks Island Fund advisors want to encourage people to consider legacy gifts to the fund and to encourage their friends and neighbors to consider such a gift.

The philosophy behind a community fund is that the people who benefit from the fund are the same people who donate to the fund, thereby creating energy that the more people who benefit, the more people who give. This philosophy certainly holds true on Peaks Island. The fund receives donations from summer residents, year-round residents, visitors who hold fond memories and others while funding grants that benefit all of these people.

The Peaks Island Fund's slogan is "Connecting people who care with causes that matter." The grants have supported just about every facet of island life from education, environmental projects, transportation, medical care, energy efficiency, gardening, arts and more. Lifetime gifts have been important in building the fund to its current balance which exceeds \$700,000 prior to this year's distributions. As the fund matures, legacy gifting becomes increasingly important in building the fund into an amount that supports meaningful annual distributions. The 2015 grant distributions equal \$46,467. As the fund grows, it will create autonomy and independence for the island. The island will be self-sufficient in funding projects that continue to support quality of life and sustainability.

As a Maine Community Foundation fund, donors have the assurance that the Peaks Island Fund will remain professionally managed and subject to rules that support a sustainable fund with a consistent mission. A legacy gift refers to planning to make a gift upon death. Often people implement legacy gifting through their wills and living trusts, which simply requires donors to state that a charitable gift shall be distributed to the Peaks Island Fund and identify the nature of the gift. The Maine Community Foundation is available to assist with further information about planned giving, which is often a strategy to reduce estate tax liability.

# Needs

An even simpler method for donors to make legacy gifts is to name the Peaks Island Fund as the beneficiary of property such as a bank account, life insurance policy or retirement plan. The donor can ask the bank or company for a form to change the beneficiary designation to the Peaks Island Fund. A gift through beneficiary designation can be the entire asset or a portion, identified as a dollar amount or percentage. This often can be accomplished on the phone, through the mail or on the internet.

Peaks Island Fund tries to recognize people who have set up legacy gifts. There are 33 individuals representing 19 households who have incorporated the Peaks Island Fund into their estate planning. Any donor who has done so, but is not included in such recognition, should contact one of the fund's advisors. Planning ahead deserves recognition because it represents a commitment to quality of life on the island and a desire to support a sustainable community.

All donations to the Peaks Island Fund are tax-deductible gifts. All grant recipients must either be a 501(c)(3) organization or have a fiscal agent that is able to accept tax-deductible gifts.

## 2015 GRANT AWARDS

### **Brackett Memorial United Methodist Church**

**\$3,120**

Support is being provided to assist with improving energy efficiency of the church's parsonage through the replacement and upgrade of several aging windows.

### **Casco Bay Health Center**

**\$2,002**

Community support to fund the purchase of a portable wrist model blood pressure cuff and portable pulse oximeter.

In addition, the center will be acquiring a new automated external defibrillator (AED).

### **Eighth Maine Regiment Memorial Association**

**\$5,000**

The Eighth Maine RMA is receiving support to address the needed care for their historical collections. This will include hiring a professional archivist to assist in policy development and planning, as well as acquiring the services of an appraiser to catalogue and value items held in the collection.

### **Fifth Maine Regiment Museum**

**\$3,500**

The Fifth Maine Regiment Museum and Cultural Center has received funding to assist in the development

and production of promotional materials, with sustainability outcomes being to increase membership, revenues, and community participation.

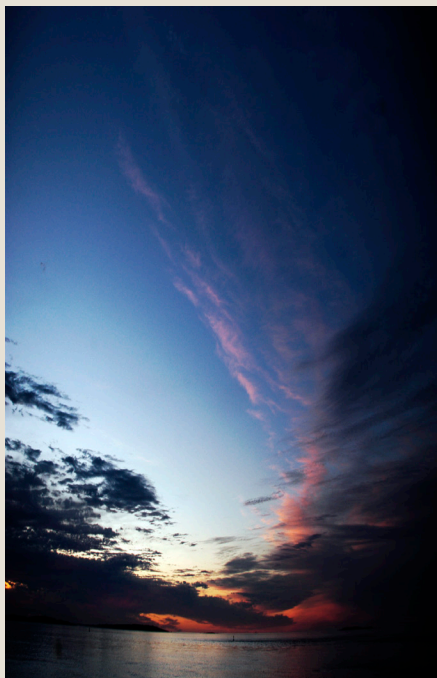
### **Homestart**

**\$5,000**

Support for Homestart is directed toward the hiring of an intern/

researcher to assist with the organization's goal of identifying and expanding affordable housing options on the island, including establishing recommendations for possible zoning changes to support such housing.

### **Island Taxi Service**

**\$1,000**

The Island Taxi will receive support for the completion of its web site, with the goal to improve communication of ITS services, programs and fundraising activities.

### **Environmental Action Team**

**\$10,000**

The Peaks Environmental Action Team (PEAT) has received a grant to bring greater energy efficiency, cleaner air and reduced heating costs to the Peaks Island Elementary School. An Island contractor will be hired to implement a variety of carpentry, air sealing, and insulation measures.

### **Elementary School-After School Academy**

**\$6,000**

Funding to the PIES After-School Academy will support children with arts, athletics and academics during after-school hours. The Academy will provide students with enrichment activities that are an extension of their learning day and meaningful to their role as young islanders.

### **St. Christopher's Church**

**\$9,645**

With a goal to complete its energy independence projects, St. Christopher's has received funding to purchase an energy-efficient heat pump for the parish house, as well as replace windows and improve insulation.

### **Volunteers of America**

**\$1,200**

Support continues to be provided to improve and make more accessible the gardens that surround the senior living community. New raised beds that allow garden tending without bending will improve and increase resident participation.

### **Peaks Island Fund "Challenge Grant"**

**\$5,000**

The PIF Advisors have set aside resources to support the establishment of a state-of-the-art, easily accessed community calendar, which was identified as a high priority by community organizations during the PIF informational breakfast in March 2015.



## PROGRESS REPORTS FOR 2014 GRANTS

### Peaks Island Fund Grants at Work!

#### Children & Youth

##### Peaks Creative Coalition

The Peaks Creative Coalition worked with the children of the Peaks Island School to design, develop and produce a community arts performance. “The children became so invested in the project, took it seriously, and were off the charts enthusiastic.” Many additional volunteers were involved, and the community turnout for the final production was very strong.

##### Peaks Island Children’s Workshop

The workshop installed a playground tricycle track for its toddlers and preschoolers. The enclosed course keeps children safely off of busy roads and creates an easy-to-navigate resource for children to develop their gross motor skills.

#### Quality Living

##### Casco Bay Health Center

The Center purchased an audiometer, which helps the clinical staff complete hearing screenings more efficiently and effectively. The unit assists in the early detection of hearing loss for both pediatric and adult patients.

##### Peaks Island Community Food Pantry

The PI Food Pantry utilized \$1,500 of its grant to provide direct food assistance, supporting almost three months of the organization’s operations. The additional \$2,000 is being used to complete the development of a website.

##### Peaks Island Lecture Series

In collaboration with the Fifth Maine Regiment Museum, the Peaks Island Lecture Series sponsored several events through the year, highlighted by the What Cheer? Brigade event in September, providing a block-party style concert with a “huge turnout.”

##### Volunteers of America

Fay Garman House collaborated with Brunswick High School’s Action Team, with 15 students and 4 adults helping to improve the facility’s garden area. “During spring and summer late afternoons residents meet informally on the back patio surrounded by raised vegetable beds and the flower gardens. The garden is a magnet for neighbors on Peaks Island to stop by and chat.”



## ***Environmental/Economic Security***

### **Fifth Maine Regiment Museum**

The Fifth Maine Regiment Museum utilized its funding to hire a Development & Events Coordinator to support the 70 events occurring at the facility. They also contracted with an area accounting firm to complete a comprehensive financial audit for the organization.

### **Peaks Environmental Action Team**

PEAT continued to help make Peaks Island greener by expanding their educational activities and programs focusing on the environment. PIF support funded printing of a brochure educating visitors about island safety and environmental concerns, as well as the purchase of another Big Belly trash compactor.

### **Peaks Island Land Preserve**

The PIF grant to PILP is designated for the completion of an engineering survey for the Ice Pond. The survey will include remedial recommendations for maintenance of the pond and a design for dam repair to help it continue to be a natural and community asset for Peaks Island. The completion of the engineering survey was pending as of May 2015.

### **St. Christopher's Church**

St. Christopher's Church utilized funding support to assist in the purchase of an energy-efficient heat pump, hot water heater and ceiling fans, showing immediate and significant reductions in costs. The church reported a savings of \$1,571 in combined oil and electricity costs for its buildings compared to the previous year.

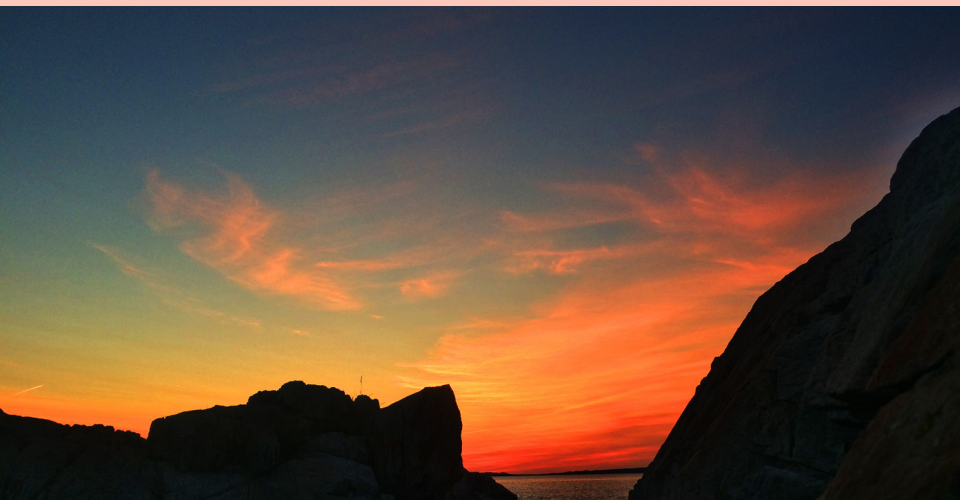

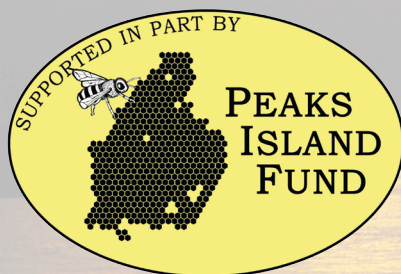
