Volunteers Identify Emerging Needs

Peaks Island Fund supporters had another great year watching current projects develop and funding new projects for the upcoming cycle. In this report, you will see grants that bring arts education, energy efficiency and more to the island because dedicated nonprofit volunteers take the time to identify the island's needs, formulate plans and request funding.

These tireless volunteers work to improve the quality of life in our community and are vital to the amazing impact that the grants have had on all people with connections to Peaks Island from year-round residents to visitors for one day.

AREAS NAMED AS PRIORITIES

The Peaks Island Fund advisors have been working to support these volunteers. One step the fund advisors took in the past year was to identify areas deemed to be priorities among islanders. Those areas are:

- reduce economic barriers to living on the island,
- provide or increase access to educational and enrichment programs for youth,
- preserve and protect the built and natural environment, including projects that reduce energy consumption,
- increase year-round social and cultural resources for the community,
- · enhance opportunities for physical accessibility on the Island, or
- collaborative projects that focus on efforts to bring Peaks Island residents together through common action and partnerships.

COLLABORATION AMONG GROUPS

The Peaks Island Fund advisors also hosted the third annual Spring Breakfast in March. This has become a time when the island's cadre of volunteers can show up and talk. This informal setting is becoming a venue for connections and collaborative ideas. Any individual is invited to attend and take part in the momentum of this ongoing conversation.

The concept behind a community fund is that the people who benefit from the fund are the same people who donate to the fund. This creates a synergy between the growing number of people who benefit and the growing number who give. This certainly holds true on Peaks Island. The fund receives donations from summer residents, year-round residents, visitors and others.

LEARN MORE ABOUT THE FUND

Following the Peaks Island Fund's slogan Connecting People Who Care with Causes that Matter, grants have supported just about every facet of island life from education, environmental projects, transportation, medical care, energy efficiency, gardening and more. Since 2004, the Peaks Island Fund has distributed more than \$400,000 to projects designed to benefit the island.

All donations to the Peaks Island Fund are tax-deductible gifts, which is why all grant recipients must either be a 501(c)(3) organization or have a fiscal agent that is able to accept tax-deductible gifts.









2016 GRANT AWARDS

Brackett Memorial United Methodist Church

\$10,429

Support is being provided to increase energy efficiency and reduce harmful emissions at the Parsonage of the Church. Work will be done to tighten the building envelope, install heat pumps for space and domestic water heating and replace the roof.

Casco Bay Health Center

\$1,800

Support given for design and development of a website to focus on island specific information.

This will make knowledge of clinic hours and services more immediately available.

Fifth Maine Regiment Museum \$1,500

The museum has received funding to replace exterior and screen doors in the kitchen area of the building.

Homestart \$2.500

Homestart received funding to obtain technical and legal assistance as needed, related to zoning proposals.

Island Transportation System \$1,000

Support is being provided to help increase fare revenue by better

informing islanders and visitors of services via ITS website, Facebook and complementary promotional activities. This will include creation of links to other websites visitors may use, mobile versions of the

site, information for realtors and refrigerator magnets.



Peaks Island Children's Workshop \$2,025

Funding is being given to provide weekly dance classes to further the emotional, physical and cognitive development of students ages 3-5. Twenty seven classes will be offered with a culminating presentation at the end of the year.

Peaks Island Elementary School \$10.000

Support is being provided to continue funding a coordinator for the successful After School Academy enrichment program begun last year which serves children and working families and connects them with creative community members.

Side X Side

\$7.560

Funding provided for an after school program with artists Pamela Moulton and Jamie Hogan that will bring critical thinking, creativity and innovation to students through a multi-disciplinary program aligned with core curriculum on Landforms and WW2 history. The program will be done in collaboration with Ocean Ave Elementary students.

Volunteers of America Northern New England

\$5,467

Funding will assist in making the Peaks Island Health Center accessible to all by installing commercial automatic door openers.



PROGRESS REPORTS FOR 2015 GRANTS

Peaks Island Fund Grants at Work!

Children & Youth

Peaks Island School

The school used its grant to establish the first year of the After School Academy. With funding to hire a daily coordinator, the program joined with Parks and Recreation, island non-profits, professionals and volunteers to provide robotics, music, art, theater, outdoor activities and clowning for students after school.



Quality Living

Casco Bay Health Center

The Center purchased a Pulse
Oximeter and Portable Blood
Pressure Cuff enabling the clinical staff
to provide care for patients who are
immobile and home bound.

Island Transportation System

Funds received were used to develop a website with the goal of increasing public awareness of the taxi and the services it provides.

Volunteers of America

The Fay Garman House used funds to create three elevated raised beds which provided easier access to gardening for residents and enhanced the neighborhood and residential life with flowers, food and herbs.



Environmental/Economic Security

Brackett Memorial United Methodist Church

The church utilized funding support to replace windows in the parsonage. The completed project led to improved energy use and created a more comfortable setting for community activity within the building.

Eighth Maine Memorial Regiment Association

The Eighth Maine used its funding to work on archiving their collection with help from the Maine Historical Society with the goal of long term preservation and care of their historic collection.

Fifth Maine Regimental Museum

With help from the Fund, the Fifth Maine worked to expand membership, be more engaged with present members and encourage more community involvement. The Museum is now able to update information with regular electronic newsletters, keeping members more connected to its mission.

Homestart

Homestart utilized funds to identify zoning barriers to affordable housing on Peaks. An expert in zoning ordinances was hired and a round table discussion of builders, planners, residents and officials was hosted.

Peaks Environmental Action Team

Support was given to bring increased energy efficiency to the Peaks Island Elementary School by significantly tightening the building's envelope. Thompson Johnson Woodworks installed double-paned basement storm windows and constructed air tight doors and hatches which, with other work, reduced the stack effect in the building.



St Christopher's Church

Funding helped make St Christopher's Parish House independent of fuel oil. Installation of heat pumps for both heating and hot water, insulating the basement and repairing and painting all the windows allowed for greater use of the parish community room for island group meetings and functions including PI Ukes, Cancer Support Group, AA and The Memoir Writing group.

GIVING TO PEAKS ISLAND

Anyone who appreciates life on Peaks understands that it's a result of the hard work and foresight of generations of island individuals, families, former residents, and friends. The Peaks Island Fund gives everyone a chance to join that legacy of generosity. The longterm goal of the Peaks Island Fund is to singly support sustainable island living through our permanent endowment fund. Thank you for considering what you might be able to share for the good of the community.

This perpetual endowment has grown from \$10 gifts to \$10,000 gifts, all made by your friends and neighbors. These are the same people who carefully consider annual grant requests and decide how to do the most good with the funds entrusted to our community. Since 2004, grants totaling \$430,000

have been awarded to 31 non-profits, school and municipal organizations. We are honored to sponsor these island non-profit organizations and thank you for continuing to support their efforts.
