

Peaks Island Fund Supports Community

The Peaks Island Fund's motto is "Linking People Who Care with Causes that Matter," and it embodies the spirit of connection and community that makes the Peaks Island Fund a vibrant part of island life.

Peaks Island is a special place to yearround residents, summer residents and day visitors. The natural beauty and ease of life are a common bond among each person who feels connected to this 760-acre rock adorned with roses, bright moons and occasional Minke whales. In addition to the natural beauty, the Peaks Island community sounds like a storybook tale to people hearing about it for the first time with its library, health clinic, trails, ice ponds, and historic buildings. But, it's no fairy tale, and by donating to the Peaks Island Fund, donors meet the needs of these island nonprofits.

The Peaks Island Fund is a community foundation fund, which means it is backed by a solid infrastructure and national standards. The fund offers donors a stable means to give back to their community in a meaningful way. The fund works with the entire community, and the advisors seek to understand the community's strengths, weaknesses, challenges and opportunities. The ongoing standard used to gauge the fund's success is impact, and how to utilize the donations for a greater impact.

In selecting grants, the board of advisors follows priorities that will contribute to quality of life and sustainability for the island community. A donation to the Peaks Island Fund goes toward grants that seek to:

- · reduce economic barriers to living on the island,
- provide or increase access to educational and enrichment programs for youth,
- preserve and protect the built and natural environment, including projects that reduce energy consumption,
- increase year-round social and cultural resources for the community,
- enhance opportunities for physical accessibility on the Island, or
- collaborative projects that focus on efforts to bring Peaks Island residents together through common action and partnerships.

LEARN MORE ABOUT THE FUND

Community foundations have existed for more than 100 years. The Peaks Island Fund began building on this foundation when it was founded in 2004. The grants support all facets of island life from education, environmental projects, transportation, medical care, energy efficiency, gardening and more. Since its inception, the Fund has distributed more than \$400,000 to projects designed to benefit the island.

A summary of recent grants is included in this annual report and past grants can be viewed on the Maine Community Foundation website, www.mainecf.org. All donations to the Peaks Island Fund are tax-deductible gifts, which is why all grant recipients must either be a 501(c)(3) organization or have a fiscal agent that is able to accept tax-deductible gifts.

Finally, everyone is invited each year to the annual celebration held in August to award grants and celebrate life on this beautiful island that binds our community.



2017 GRANT AWARDS

Casco Bay Health Center \$938.40

Funds provided will purchase a water cooler to be used by patients and clinic staff.

Fifth Maine Regiment Museum \$4,300

Funds are being given to replace the exterior and screen doors in the dining area of the building and to fix related structural damage. This will improve security for the building, safety for those who use it and overall appearance.

Peaks Island Children's Workshop \$5,000

Grant support is being given to replace and extend existing roofs on the PICW's three porches to protect the safety of students and shield heat pumps from damage.

Peaks Island Land Preserve \$10.000

Support is being provided to help pay for the repair of the failing Ice Pond dam.

Peaks Island School \$10,000

Continued support is being provided to the After School Academy enrichment program which serves children and working families and connects them with creative community members.

Portland Public Library \$1,333

Funding is being provided to complete the preservation and digitization of a unique collection of Peaks Island history including newspapers, newsletters, clipping albums, post cards, the work of Peaks Island Authors, cemetery records, photos and other ephemera which the branch library has collected since 1978. All will then be made available to the public.

St Christopher's Parish

\$2,550

Support being provided to complete the final phase of St Christopher's Energy Independence Project by replacing two deteriorated entry doors with properly fitted insulated doors.

Volunteers of America

\$1,000

Funds will be used to improve the vegetable and herb gardens at Fay Garman House, using small spaces more efficiently and maximizing the productivity of the raised beds to make gardening more accessible to residents.



PROGRESS REPORTS FOR 2016 GRANTS

Peaks Island Fund Grants at Work!

Children & Youth

Peaks Island Children's Workshop

The Workshop used its grant to provide weekly dance classes to further the emotional, physical and cognitive development of students age 3-5. Twenty seven classes were offered with a culminating presentation at the end of the year.

Peaks Island Elementary School

The school was able to continue funding a coordinator for the successful After School Academy enrichment program which serves children and working families and connects them with creative community members.

Side X Side

Island students experienced an after school program with local artists that brought critical thinking, creativity and innovation to students through a multi-disciplinary program aligned with core curriculum on Landforms and WW2 history.









Quality Living

Casco Bay Health Center

The Health Center was able to design and develop a website to focus on island specific information. This made knowledge of clinic hours and services more immediately available.

Island Transportation System

With the help of a grant, ITS was able to increase fare revenue by better informing islanders and visitors of services via the ITS website, Facebook and complimentary promotional activities. This included creation of links to other websites visitors may use, mobile versions of the site, information for realtors and refrigerator magnets.

Volunteers of America Northern New England

Funds were used to make the Peaks Island Health Center accessible to all by installing commercial automatic door openers.

Environmental/Economic Security

Brackett Memorial United Methodist Church

The Church worked to increase energy efficiency and reduce harmful emission at the Parsonage. Work was done to tighten the building envelope, install heat pumps for space and domestic water heating and replace the roof.

Fifth Maine Regiment Museum

The museum replaced the exterior and screen doors in the kitchen area of the building.

Homestart

Homestart worked to expand its website and to obtain technical and legal assistance as needed related to zoning proposals.
